

**CCCMA BOARD MEETING**  
**MINUTES**  
**March 1, 2025**

**Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order by President Eric Wong at 12:07 PM.

**Present:** Eric Wong, Marty Bailey, Peter Bickers, Brandon Polanco, David Nott, Gil Garcia, and Tosh Nishimura.

**Absent:** None.

**Management Present:** None.

### Social Chairman's Update

**Proposed Social Event:**

- A proposal was made to host a **Monday Night Football & Poker Night** in the upstairs room at CCC.
- Discussion ensued regarding the potential to hire an external company to facilitate the event.
- The event could serve as a member benefit, with a \$250 rental fee charged to the public.

### Tournament Chairman's Update

- **First Tournament of 2025:**
- Scheduled for **April 19th**
  - The Master's Tournament.
  - Potential impact from course reseeding/aeration at the end of March was noted.
- **Club Championship:**
  - To be held over three consecutive Saturdays – **May 3rd, 10th, and 17th.**
  - Entry fee will be **\$100 per participant.**
- **2025/2026 CCC Season:**
  - Begins **June 7th**, with tournament fees set at **\$50**, inclusive of lunch. Participants opting out of lunch will still incur the same fee.

### Open Discussion

**Valentine's Dinner Event:**

- The event was priced at \$69 per person for a steak and lobster meal, providing excellent quality and value.
- While the Men's Club showed strong support, overall attendance was low.

- It was noted that without the Men's Club's participation, the event would have seen minimal turnout.

### **Board Member Tournament:**

- Following the Club Championship, each Board Member will host an individual tournament.

### **Team Play Update**

#### **General Performance & Participation:**

- Most players participated in at least one round; however, some teams lacked alternate players.
- The six-week competition was challenging, with some teams, except for Industry Hills, exhibiting limited cooperation.

#### **Challenges Encountered:**

- **Santa Anita Incident:**
  - CCC players were unexpectedly required to pay for practice rounds due to miscommunication.
  - During a match, a CCC player called out an opponent for using a non-conforming club, which resulted in the opponent refusing the penalty and exhibiting aggressive behavior.
  - The matter was escalated to **SCGA**, resulting in the opponent's disqualification and a team match loss.
- **Other Club Issues:**
  - **Upland Hills:** Poor organization, lack of communication, and subpar lunch arrangements were noted.
  - **Santa Anita:** The team's behavior and captain's conduct were problematic, prompting discussions on excluding future play with them
  - **Industry Hills:** The only Club that handled things properly.
- **Positive Outcomes:**
  - Two female players joined the team, one of whom secured a match win – a notable milestone.
  - New team members expressed overall positive experiences despite challenges.

#### **Future of Team Play:**

- It was decided to avoid future matches with Santa Anita and Upland Hills.

- A preference to partner with private clubs was expressed to ensure a better competition experience.
- Discussions were held about allowing non-board members to volunteer as team captains moving forward.

**Tee Time Allocation:**

- Concerns were expressed about the potential reduction of Saturday morning tee times, which have historically been provided as a courtesy to the Men's Club.
- Maintain proactive and positive relations with management to preserve tee times and fair pricing.

**Adjournment:** With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at **12:58 PM**.
